Prof. Zdzislaw Kedzia introduced the theme of the Venice School *Human Rights as our Responsibility* and **Mr. Jean-Louis Ville** (Development and Cooperation – EuropeAid) explained the role of the European Union in terms of *EU's Responsibility as a regional entity, as a donor, and as the EIDHR manager*.

Participants were divided into three clusters: *Business and Human Rights* (Cluster responsible: Prof. Menno Kamminga); *Development and Human Rights* (Cluster Responsible: Prof. Dr. Zdzislaw Kedzia) and (Cluster Responsible: Prof. Stelios Perrakis).

Students were invited, according to the specific programme of each cluster, to debate on challenging human rights issues as well as to participate in a moot court and in a simulation of negotiation between Governments, UN Bodies and Civil Society. Moreover, among the results achieved by the students was also the development of practical aid programmes related to single countries used as examples.

The Faculty included internationally recognised high level experts in the field of human rights such as Prof. Eric David, Mr. Martyn Day, Prof. Jan Eijsbout, Mr. Christopher Gosnell, Mr. Ryszard Komenda, Prof. Stephen Marks, Dr. Maria-Daniella Marouda, Mr. Craig Mokhiber and Mr. Jennifer Zerk.
