Martin Scheinin to open the Venice School of Human Rights 2014



The 2014 edition of the Venice School of Human Rights

will be opened by **Professor Martin Scheinin**, former UN Special Rapporteur on the promotion and protection of human rights and fundamental freedoms while countering terrorism, and current Professor of International Law and Human Rights at the European University Institute of Florence.
