Prof. Jeffrey Kenner, from the University of Nottingham, and Prof. Steve Peers, from the University of Essex, introduced the second day with a focus on the economic and social rights in the EU Charter, then **Prof. Steve Peers** had a lecture on the asylum and immigration case law.

Gabriel Toggenburg, responsible for the coordination of the FRA annual report, introduced the participants to EU Charter resources for legal practitioners.
