Venice Academy of Human Rights on "Obligations of States" is now taking place!



The fourth edition of the <u>Venice Academy of Human Rights</u> started successfully on 8 July 2013 and is dedicated to the theme "Obligations of States".

Following lectures and seminars will focus on the common good, rights and justice, liberty and security, insiders and outsiders, the rule of law, accountability and political community and immigration.

Participants will further present and discuss their own "work-in-progress" such as drafts of articles, chapters of doctoral theses or other projects. Selected contributions by participants may also be published in a working papers series. A research agenda on this year's theme, elaborated by the participants, will be published on the academy's website.
