Introduction

The International Institute for Democracy and Electoral Assistance (International IDEA) and the European Inter-University Centre for Human Rights and Democratisation (EIUC) are jointly organising a workshop on democratic governance for young leaders of the Middle East and North Africa Region.

The workshop, which takes place from 25 to 31 May 2008 in Venice-Lido at the EIUC seat, the Monastery of San Nicolò, is realised with funding from the Italian Government and the European Commission and with the organisational assistance of the AI Kawakibi Democracy Transition Centre. The Arab Democracy Foundation (ADF) further supports the organisation of the Workshop by sponsoring a number of participants.

Participants in the programme are advanced university students or young graduates, under 30 years of age, with varied educational background related to the workshop's topic as well as practical experience as activists and advocates of human rights and democracy in their countries of origin. Participants represent the following MENA countries: Algeria, Morocco, Jordan, Yemen, Palestine, Tunisia, Syria, Lebanon, Egypt, Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, and Iraq.

The language of the seminar is English.

The topics to be discussed during the workshop include constitution building, designing electoral systems, managing elections, political parties, womeninpolitics, post-conflict democratic processes, human rights, democracy and development.

Facilitators are recruited from the organising institutions as well as from partner institutions in the MENA region.

All issues are tackled using a participatory methodology with the aim to establish a fruitful dialogue between the young leaders and the facilitators as well as to deepen the regional specificity of the topic.
