The University and the City

Adam Mickiewicz University bears the name of a Polish bard who believed strongly in a free, multicultural Poland and was one of the most important poets of European Romanticism. It is one of the largest academic centres in Poland. At its 15 Departments (Faculties), the University currently employs nearly 3,000 teaching staff, including 357 tenured professors, 482 AMU professors and 1,519 doctors and senior lecturers. Adam Mickiewicz University, including its Faculty of Law and Administration, regularly enjoys one of the highest rankings among Polish universities. Poznań is a town in west-central Poland with over 560,000 inhabitants. Located at the Warta river, it is one of the oldest cities in Poland (first mentioning in old chronicles goes back to 968), making it an important historical centre and a vibrant centre of trade, industry, and education. Its remarkable old town with a large Old Market is a lively area of social life. You can see in Poznań extraordinary examples of different architecture styles - from Romanesque to Secession. Poznań's cathedral is the oldest in the country, containing the tombs of the first Polish rulers: Duke Mieszko I and King Boleslaus the Brave. Each part of the city has its own unique character. Poznań is Poland's fifth largest city, fourth biggest industrial centre, and has a huge student community. It is also the administrative capital of the Greater Poland Voivodeship.
